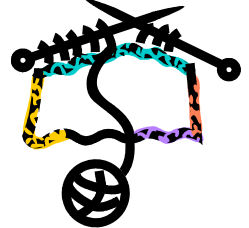
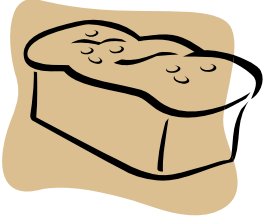

## HOME ECONOMICS, GARDEN, FARM CROPS RULES

1. General rules of the Madison County Fair apply where applicable.
2. These Department Rules apply to all sections. Read carefully and follow all rules for all sections. **Please pay attention to the numbers listed in this catalog and not a catalog from a previous year or another fair.**
3. This department is divided into 14 sections. Each section has individual classes of entries. Exhibitors may enter only one entry per class.
4. Age divisions are as of September 30 of the fair year:  
Youth 5-8: ages 5-8 (no exhibitors under age 5)      Junior Youth: ages 9-13  
Senior Youth: ages 14-19      Adult: over 19  
Senior Citizen: any participant over age 65 not wishing to be judged in the Adult Division  
Special Citizen: any mentally or physically handicapped participant not wishing to be judged
5. For Jr. and Sr. Youth exhibitors, there will be a \$1.00 entry fee for **each Home Ec section** (not each class in a section) entered, payable during registration. Entry fees (checks) should be made payable to the Madison County Fair Board. There will be no fee for Youth 5-8, Adults, Special Citizens, or Senior Citizens.
6. Premiums will be paid to Jr. and Sr. Youth participants. Premiums will be: Blue: \$3; Red: \$2; White: \$1; Best in Show: \$5. No premiums will be paid for entries placing below a White Award.
7. Awards will be given in each section to the person in each age division who accumulates the most points. Points will be awarded as follows: Blue: 3 points, Red: 2 points, White: 1 point, Best in Show: 5 points. No points are given for any placing below White.
8. The Home Ec Building will be cleared of all unofficial people during judging. The building will be open to the public only during designated times for security purposes.
9. All exhibits must have been completed and/or prepared by the exhibitor since the previous fair. Youth 5-8, Jr. Youth, and Special Citizens may receive help with their entries, but the work must be mostly their own.
10. There will be hostesses on duty in the building at all times. They are available to answer questions about exhibits and for security purposes.
11. Any **youth** with twelve (12) or more entries in the Home Ec Department will receive a free T-shirt and week-long entry pass unless the exhibitor has already received a week's pass from another department.
12. A Best of Show exhibit may be chosen in each division in each section from those receiving blue ribbons. Judges are not required to award Blue ribbons or Best in Show prizes if they do not feel that they are deserved (see Judging Standards).
13. Exhibitors are asked to fill out the entry form provided in this catalog before registration, but forms and assistance will be available during registration.
14. Registration will be held between 4:00 and 8:00 PM on Monday, July 13, at the Home Ec Building on the fairgrounds. Items will not be accepted after registration closes.
15. Exhibits must be picked up between 2:00 & 4:00 PM on Sunday, July 19. Exhibits may not be removed earlier! Anyone removing exhibits from the building before designated times will automatically forfeit all premium money and prizes won. Premium money and prizes will be given only during the designated pickup time. Any items not picked up by 4:00 PM will be removed to the Madison County Cooperative Extension Office and all premiums and prizes will be forfeited. Unclaimed items may be picked up during normal office hours at the Extension Office, and will be discarded after one week.

# **JUDGING STANDARDS FOR HOME ECONOMICS DEPARTMENT**

All items entered into the fair will be judged on the following criteria:

- Appearance: presentation, cleanliness, neatness, and design
- Workmanship
- Suitability to category
- Suitability and/or creativity of materials used

All entries will be judged against a standard of quality and creativity, and not against each other. The department judges are highly knowledgeable in their areas. The Blue Award is given to exhibitors best meeting the standard, then the Red Award, and then White. Judges are not required to give each award in a single category. Judges are allowed to give more than one award in a single category.

Individual sections will be judged on the following additional criteria:

## **CANNED GOODS**

- Uniformity of solids, consistency of liquids, and proportion of solids to liquids
- Flavor: taste and aroma
- Natural look and taste
- Frosting: consistency and suitability for cake

## **BAKED GOODS**

- Consistent shape, size, color, & thickness for entries of more than one item (ie. cookies, biscuits)
- Texture, level of moistness
- Well-cooked
- Flavor: taste and odor

## **ART WORK & CRAFTS**

- Design: composition and creativity
- Technique and use of materials

## **PHOTOGRAPHY**

- Composition
- Creativity of subject matter
- Contrast, color usage
- Clarity of both the shot and printing

## **NEEDLE ARTS, SEWING, & QUILTING**

- Design or pattern's relationship to shape and size of article, use of article
- Presentation
- Workmanship: stitches used, finished edges, suitability of materials to purpose

## **FLOWERS, GARDEN, & FARM CROPS**

- Specimens: quality, freedom from injury/flaws
- Arrangements/displays: use of available products, appearance and presentation, use of color

# SECTION BG: BAKED GOODS / FOOD PREPARATION

## SECTION RULES

1. All general rules apply.
2. Entries must be on disposable plates and in zipper-type closure plastic bags, except for decorated cakes. Larger items that do not fit in plastic bags must be easy to open. Mis-packaged items will not be accepted.
3. No mixes may be used in baked exhibits.
4. Decorated cakes will be judged on appearance alone and will not be cut or tasted, so forms may be used.
5. All food must have been prepared by the exhibitor; youth exhibitors are allowed to receive help from adults. Siblings may NOT enter items from the same batch.
6. No custard, cream or meringue pies will be accepted. Nothing that will spoil overnight without refrigeration will be accepted.
7. Except for decorated items, entries must be submitted as follows: Individual items (biscuits, muffins, rolls, cookies): plate of three; pies: 1/4 pie; breads: half-loaves; cakes: half-cakes.

## SECTION P: PHOTOGRAPHY

### SECTION RULES

1. All general rules apply.
2. Photos must have been **taken**, not just developed or printed, since the last fair.
3. Photos may be from digital or film cameras.
4. Due to space restrictions, exhibitors will be limited to eight entries in this section.
5. Except for class P-13, photos must be mounted on a piece of WHITE poster board, illustration board, or mat board, with a margin of one to two inches all around. Photos may not be in frames! Photos mounted incorrectly will not be judged.
6. Photos may be color or black & white, and will be judged together in classes, except where designated.
7. Acceptable photo sizes range from 3.5x5 to 8x12, or a panoramic shot. Entries for P-20 may not exceed 8x12 inches in total size.

4. For youth to enter, they must have helped with most of the planting, care, and harvesting.

## SECTION AG: AGRICULTURAL FARM CROPS

### SECTION RULES

1. All general rules apply.
2. All crops must have been grown since the last fair from the home or farm under the care of the person in whose name they are entered. For youth entries, a farm cared for by a relative is acceptable providing that the youth helped with the majority of planting, care, and harvesting. Items by a group must be entered under the group's name, not by a single person.
3. All loose grains must be cleaned and in a clear quart jar. All honey and sorghum must be in clear pint or quart jars and properly labeled.
4. All eggs must be from birds under the primary care of the person in whose name they are submitted. Eggs should be submitted in egg cartons, big end up. Eggs will be judged on cleanliness, uniformity, and color.
5. All hay and straw must be submitted as one slice, tied. Whole bales will **not** be accepted.

## SECTION 4H: 4-H SCRAPBOOKS & POSTERS

1. Posters must have been designed on or affixed to standard posterboard, 14" x 22".
2. Well known characters such as Snoopy, Batman, Scooby-Doo, etc., may not be used due to copyright restrictions.
3. Posters must promote 4-H or the Madison County Fair, or be a 4-H project poster.
4. All posters must have been made since the last fair.
5. Cloverbuds will not compete, but will receive ribbons.

## **4- H Scrapbook** (This is not the same as record books.)

### **SECTION RULES**

1. Scrapbook must have been compiled since last year's fair and must be the work of the person in whose name it is entered.
2. The book may be on a specific project or an overall scrapbook including all of the 4-H-er's activities.
3. The book must include a title page with the 4-H-er's name, age, and club on it.
4. This department is for 4-H scrapbooks only. Other scrapbooks can be exhibited in the Crafts department.
5. Cloverbuds are Youth 5-8; they will not compete, but all will receive ribbons. Novice exhibitors are those who are completing a 4-H project for the first time.
6. Club books are to be entered in the club's name, not a single member of the club.
